

● BOARD MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 19 WILL REVIEW LAWN AREAS REDESIGN AGAIN

That meeting will renew the discussion of a proposed redesign of the lawn areas at Grandview Farm. The specifics were introduced in the July Board meeting with only a handful of Condo owners present.

As voters in Grandview Farm, we have in our hands a very simple ballot dealing with one race in the Provo City election in November for city-wide council seat #2. There are seven names on the ballot. However, we have all been informed by e-mail that Ari Emmanuel Webb should not be considered as a candidate. Who knows what may have happened to poor Ari?

Two of the six remaining candidates have sent flyers to your postal mail box with not enough information to feel very confident in them. Of course, we could just look at their photograph and make a choice that way.

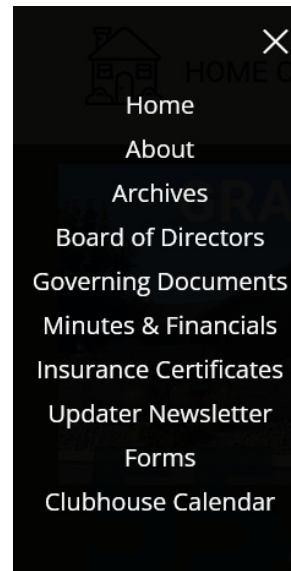
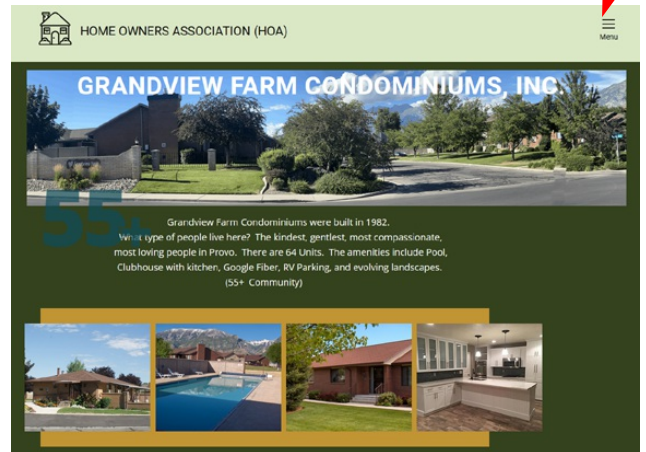
